Summative Document

This document provides a summative view of the University of West Florida's (UWF) Triumph Proposal, Project 10[x]. The summative document includes (1) Strategies to support industry certifications; (2) CAPE certifications to be offered; and (3) the five-year budget request.

Strategies to Support Industry Certifications

UWF will address the challenge of employers' inability to find and fill critical gaps in the high tech workforce. Industry certifications are recognizable, transferable skills that will continue to benefit the prosperity pipeline for many years to come. This project will produce some of the nation's most talented and elite professionals that are highly skilled, credentialed and ready to work.

Through the Center for Cybersecurity, The Sea3D Additive Manufacturing Laboratory and the Hal Marcus College of Science and Engineering, UWF will leverage its resources to offer industry certifications through an array of strategies. These strategies will include:

- Alignment with specific degree programs in cybersecurity and manufacturing,
- Offerings in UWF STEM Living-Learning Communities,
- Focused industry trainings to upskill citizens in Northwest Florida aligned with small businesses, industry and the military across the region, and
- Engaged STEM Summer Camps and Bootcamps.

During this project, UWF will hire three year-long Innovators-in-Residence to provide industry insights exemplifying the application of innovative practice in cybersecurity and manufacturing in their own organizations. We will search for accomplished high profile executives and scholars that have a strong portfolio to work with students, instructors, participants and to present public lectures in the community.
