DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED PROJECT:

commerce located within the disproportionately affected counties.

The Economic Development Council of Okaloosa County has been engaged with an advanced manufacturing company that is seeking a large, strategically located parcel on which to construct a nearly one million square foot facility that would produce products for the energy sector. The company – identified as Project Reese – anticipates investing approximately \$750,000,000 in building and equipping the state-of-the-art facility. In addition, the company would employ more than 3,000 northwest Floridians by 2024 at an average wage that meets or exceeds the 115% of average wage requirement (in Okaloosa's case, 115% of the current average wage of \$42,848 would equate to \$48,857). A project of this magnitude would transform and diversify the region's economy in a way that has long been dreamt of.

Noting the significant locational advantages of the 10,500 acre Shoal River Ranch Gigasite, the company has informed Enterprise Florida that the site has been shortlisted for this monumental opportunity expected to result in a \$754,000,000 capital investment on 250 acres. Further, the company has indicated that Shoal River Ranch is the only site that remains under consideration in Florida, and is one of only a very small number of finalists nationwide. The company is now seeking a final value proposition from the states and communities that remain under consideration, with a due date of Friday, April 10. Given the sheer impact and scale of this project, the Economic Development Council of Okaloosa County respectfully requests funding support of \$34,822,786 from Triumph Gulf Coast that will be applied as follows:

WATER & SEWER EXTENSIONS FROM US HWY 90 TO 250 ACRE REESE PARCEL:

With Triumph Gulf Coast Project #43 providing \$1.5 million in grant funding to support the extensions of water and sewer lines east on US Highway 90 to the Jericho Road intersection (the entrance to the Shoal River Ranch Gigasite), Project Reese's preferred site is positioned approximately .9 mi south of what will soon be the terminus of these lines once the project is completed. As such, and based on current estimates, an additional \$500,000 is needed to extend the lines to a point adjacent to Reese's preferred parcel. Funding Request - \$900,000

MASTER LIFT STATION

Given the volume of sewer flows provided by Project Reese – coupled with anticipated long term needs for the continued build-out of the Shoal River Ranch Gigasite (the prospects of which should be considerably accelerated with a large scale and noteworthy first tenant) – a master lift station is needed. Funding Request - \$1,750,000

JERICHO ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

A public, county-owned Right-of-Way, Jericho Road serves as the primary access point into the Shoal River Ranch Gigasite. Located perpendicular to US Highway 90, Jericho Road is an unimproved facility that also abuts Project Reese's preferred site on the eastern boundary of the parcel. Of note, approximately .9 mi must be traversed on Jericho Road in order to access Project Reese's preferred site. This facility must be improved / paved for the project to succeed. Funding Request - \$900,000

US HIGHWAY 90 INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS / SIGNALIZATION

Currently a moderately traveled, two-lane highway with no turn lanes nor acceleration / deceleration lanes and no stoplight, significant intersection improvements allowing for safety and the efficient flow of traffic associated with Project Reese's anticipated maximum of 6,000 employee trips (3,000 employees, 2x daily) and truck-based shipments must be made. Required improvements must also work in concert with the existing Florida Gulf & Atlantic railroad crossing at US 90 and Jericho Road. Funding Request - \$1,000,000

PAD READY SITE

Currently under a purchase option agreement with the Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners, the 250 acre site being considered by Project Reese will require clearing, grubbing and grading in order to become truly "pad ready" and able to accommodate the \$300 million, one million square foot building that Project Reese seeks to construct. Funding Request - \$5,000,000

AD VALOREM TAX REDUCTION

Under Okaloosa County's Economic Development Ad Valorem Tax Exemption (EDATE) program approved by voters in 2014, the Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners has the ability to exempt 100% of the County's portion of the overall property tax millage (both Real and Tangible Personal Property) for up to 10 years for qualifying projects. Certainly, Project Reese resoundingly meetings the criteria for this program. Anticipating approval by the Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners for a 10 year, 100% EDATE exemption for Project Reese, the Economic Development Council of Okaloosa County is requesting that Triumph Gulf Coast provide funding

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that would equate to the portion of the company's anticipated ad valorem property tax (both Real Property and Tangible Personal Property) bill that is not eligible for exemption under Okaloosa County's Economic Development Ad Valorem Tax Exemption (EDATE) program.

Based on current information provided by Project Reese and utilizing calculations provided by the Okaloosa County Property Appraiser's office, the resulting tax bill on the Real Property (building) portion of the project is estimated to be \$807,670 per year, assuming a total assessed value of \$77.9M. Over 10 years, this would equate to \$8,076,704 in ad valorem taxes owed by the company for the building. Okaloosa County's anticipated EDATE award (based on 100% of County millage) would translate to \$2,984,061 of \$8,076,704 being exempted, leaving \$5,092,643 as unexempted. Funding Request for Real Property Ad Valorem Tax Reduction - \$5,092,643 over 10 years, or \$509,264 per year.

Given current information, it has also been estimated that the company's tax bill would be \$32,005,233 over 10 years for the Tangible Personal Property (equipment) portion of the project. Standard depreciation would result in a peak assessed value of \$490M in Year 1 (2022) and declining gradually over the 10 year period to an assessed value of \$133M in Year 10 (2031). Okaloosa County's anticipated EDATE award (based on 100% of County millage) would translate to \$11,824,820 of \$32,005,233 being exempted, leaving \$20,180,413 as unexempted. Funding Request for Tangible Personal Property Ad Valorem Tax Rate Reduction – **\$20,180,143**; annual contribution values would vary each year based on depreciation.
