EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Center for Strategic Military Excellence (CSME), in partnership with the Monument to Women Veterans, will develop an education and resource center for all Veterans who seek guidance, mentorship, and direction after their career in the military. This center will serve as a Veteran Welcome and Information Center and will provide resources from local entities, the Department of Veterans Affairs, and State and Federal Veteran support services. The CSME will also offer career and educational guidance via fast-track certifications and apprenticeship programs within local partnered companies and organizations. With the goal of eliminating shortages in critical trade industries, the CSME will focus on programs within the Construction, Hospitality, Culinary, and Information Technology fields. The CSME's primary mission is to assist all Veterans with discovering and utilizing the local, state, and federal resources needed to ensure their successful transition back into the civilian workforce.

In partnership with The Monument to Women Veterans, the CSME will provide a state-of-the-art career training center for veterans. This training center will provide veterans with resources, vocational rehabilitation, job placement, and expertise in construction, hospitality, culinary, and business information technology. Everdean Construction has committed to be the Private investor as well as the Master Developer for the CSME as well as our partnered programs with The Monument to Women Veterans (Museum and Monument). Everdean Construction is fully licensed and insured to provide complete construction services in both the residential and commercial markets. Their BuildZoom score is 110 which ranks them in the top 4% of over 400,000 Florida Licenses Contractors. They have a multimillion-dollar bond capacity.

Our mission is to build the abandoned Amtrak Station in downtown Pensacola (located at 980 Heinberg St) into a multi-use facility which will include the CSME (Education and Resource Center) and the Museum to Women Veterans, in partnership with Monument to Women Veterans, Inc. This layout will allow us to lease office space on the west side of the building to companies who participate in fast-track certifications and/or apprenticeship programs that Veterans will be able to register for as they plan a new career outside of the military. The layout will also consist of a large conference/training room to facilitate training and testing for in-house programs, such as College Level Examination Programs (CLEP).

Everdean construction will be the **Master Developer** as well as the **Private Investor** for any & all projects associated with the Monument & Museum to Women Veterans, including the CSME. We are also currently in the process of applying for CRA grant funding, acquiring local city/county appropriations, and partnership with numerous strategic businesses and foundations looking to partner with veteran supportive entities, like the CSME.

Currently, other sources of funding we are attempting to acquire are grants from CRA, Impact 100, and appropriation funds from the City of Pensacola, Escambia County, and State of Florida. This project, along with our partnership with the Monument to Women Veterans, Inc. will produce an economic impact of over \$9 million dollars annually. This statistic is based on tourism as well as the saturated presence of active duty, retired, and separated veterans on the Gulf Coast. A Veteran education and resource center, partnered with arts and culture projects such as the Museum and Monument to Women Veterans will serve the local community by increasing the desirability of businesses and industry to move to the Pensacola area.

We are seeking Triumph funds in the amount of \$2,410,893 as stated in our preliminary project estimate attached to the next page.
