Expanding and Enhancing Healthcare Programs at the University of West Florida

Executive Summary

i) The amount of funding being sought from Triumph Gulf Coast

We are requesting a total amount of \$4,867,000 from Triumph Gulf Coast to support nursing students in existing and new programs, as well as to enhance the education of students in the Medical Laboratory Science program and to develop a new Bachelor's program in Respiratory Therapy.

ii) The amount and identify of other source of funds for the proposed project or program

The University of West Florida will commit funds acquired from a recent state allocation to support Nursing education programs. The University received recurring funds to hire additional faculty to support existing and new nursing programs. Recurring funds were also received for Nursing scholarships and to purchase educational equipment.

iii) The location of the project or program

The program will be located in 3 buildings on the University of West Florida's main Pensacola campus. The Nursing programs and clinical education of the Respiratory Therapy students will be located in Building 37. This building will also be the location for all proposed renovations for the project. The Medical Laboratory Sciences program is located in Building 58, and will be the location for most laboratory science equipment purchases. Finally, the Respiratory Therapy faculty and administrative offices will be located in Building 38. A link to the campus map for the University of West Florida can be found here.

iv) Summary description of the of the proposed program

The proposed program will expand the capacity for and increase the preparation and skills of healthcare students at the University of West Florida. Workforce data prepared by the UWF Haas Center suggests that in the next 5 years, there will be regional growth rate increases of 7.5% for Medical Lab Technicians, 23% in Nursing, and 5% in Respiratory Therapy. Currently, the number of job postings far exceeds the number of educational completions in the region for these occupations. This data (source: Lightcast) is reinforced by discussion at the December 2022 Usha Kundu, MD College of Health Advisory Board. At this meeting, C-level administrators and Human Resource Directors from health care providers in Escambia and Santa Rosa counties shared that these were priority areas of focus for UWF.

The proposed program will enhance the education and preparation of the existing students in our Medical Laboratory Science and entry-level Nursing programs. The program is critical as nursing students need to prepare for the Next Generation NCLEX examination for licensure in the State of Florida. Medical Laboratory Science students need hands-on training with equipment found in hospitals and private labs. Further, the program will assist with starting two

new nursing programs at UWF. One will be an evening/weekend bachelor's degree that will allow current employees of regional healthcare providers access to nursing education outside of regular business hours. The other will be a direct entry Master's degree that will enable students who have a bachelor's in science to become a registered nurse. The two programs will enhance the number of new RN's that UWF can contribute to the workforce. Two additional enhancements for Nursing are planned within the project period. First, the University will create a Living, Learning Community (LLC) for Nursing. The LLC will provide enhanced educational opportunities for nursing students and earlier access to NCLEX preparation materials. Students in the LLC will also have earlier exposure to our healthcare partners and exposure to clinical settings. Second, UWF will begin a direct admission process for the existing Bachelor's Degree in Nursing. This enhancement is designed to recruit and retain more high-performing students in the immediate area by guaranteeing them placement in the nursing program rather than making them enter the University as a pre-nursing major. Finally, this program will allow UWF to prepare for and start a bachelor's degree in Respiratory Therapy. There are no existing programs in either Escambia or Santa Rosa counties. Therefore this program will make an immediate impact.

To accomplish these goals, the University of West Florida will commit recurring funds acquired from the state to hire new nursing faculty and purchase educational technology to support the existing and new Nursing programs. Funds are requested from Triumph Gulf coast to assist with renovations to Building 37 (Nursing) that would increase the Nursing clinical and simulation spaces by over 1500 sq feet. Additionally, requested funds would be used to improve the simulation and laboratory equipment for the MLS and nursing student education, and finally, to help with the start-up costs for a Respiratory therapy program. UWF is committed to the sustainability of this program and will budget for the recurring costs of the program beyond the project period.
