On June 7th, 2022, a large employer in Bay County, Florida announced it would permanently cease operations in Panama City, Florida. This resulted in a loss of 450 jobs, \$52 Million in payroll and an overview impact of \$350 Million to the community. A large population of the workforce spent their entire career working for this company.

The facility had been producing containerboard, primarily heavyweight kraft and fluff pulp, with a combined capacity of 645,000 tons. The company was also major user of the Port of Panama City.

In an effort to protect exist businesses surrounding the former company such as Eastern Shipbuilding, Kraton and the Port of Panama City, the Bay county commission is making an effort to purchase the 350-acre piece of property for an estimated \$30M. The remaining property that is not needed by these three organizations will be re-developed into industrial property for the Bay EDA to market to potential prospective companies.

Currently, Eastern Shipbuilding Group has more than 1,300 employees in Bay County with annual revenue of \$353M.

Port Panama City employs 50 people and in 2022, the Port set an all time high cargo records seeing a record breaking revenue increase of 6%.

Kraton is a global company with more than 1,500 employees and \$1.7B in revenue. Currently the Panama City location has 100 employees.

Bay County is requesting a \$15M grant from Triumph Gulf Coast in support of the purchase of this property. \$15M will come from BP/Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill Funds and private investors.

The specific fund used will be Restore Act (Pot 1) which can be used for eligible activities such as:

- Workforce development and job creation
- Infrastructure projects benefitting the economy, including port infrastructure.
