Please accept this letter as further support of Okaloosa Technical College's application for funding of OTC North.

OTC is proud to be the only post-secondary program in Okaloosa County with Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) accreditation. ASE is the only nationally recognized automotive certification and is the standard for training excellence in the industry. Therefore, the OTC North satellite campus will immediately hold this accreditation upon expansion. Additionally, OTC is the only program in the county to offer dual-enrollment in Automotive instruction. For students, expansion to OTC North would better support the career industry pathway by serving dual enrolled students at Crestview High, Baker, and Laurel Hill schools. With an increasing focus on emerging technology in the industry, our program located on the north end to serve area residents, would be the only program to offer training in electric and hybrid vehicles. Many of the skills learned in this pathway would support students who later aspire to train in related careers such as, diesel and airframe technicians. Finally, the automotive program at OTC North will also offer students the opportunity to earn advanced certifications that lead to ASE-Certified Master Automobile Technician status. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment for automotive services technicians in the Crestview-Fort Walton Beach-Destin, Florida, area is 650 and the annual mean wage is \$46,760. This does not include self-employed workers, of which the industry has many.

Further, I would like to offer possible uses for the building space Project Sound will lease for three years until their facility is ready for occupation. As explained, after that lease period they will vacate the campus allowing for further program expansion at this site. First and foremost, use of the space will be industry-driven and based on the needs of our local businesses. When the time comes to transition the space into an educational setting, we will work closely with our advisory councils and business partners to keep current on forecasts and trends within industry. At this time, expanding our manufacturing and production programs will be the most likely scenario. The state of Florida has awarded more than \$28 million toward the Florida Job Growth Grant to expand semiconductor manufacturing and chip manufacturing. Okaloosa County and OTC North would like to become a driving force in training a workforce for the semiconductor industry. Our goal is to train students for



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high-demand, high-wage jobs for the future. We also will leverage our strong relationship with the HSU Educational Foundation, a member of our institutional advisory member to determine a right niche for our efforts in the area of future programming. A multitude of skills, certifications, and training programs could be realized through this next phase of expansion that align perfectly with growth efforts around Bob Sikes Airport and Shoal River Ranch.

The following table outlines the programs, certifications offered for each program, and the projected number of certifications earned to demonstrate how OTC North will contribute to the disproportionately affected county over the course of the grant period (7 years). The goal is to continue growth and development through the ten (10) year mark and well beyond.

2024-2025 is considered the renovation year so no certifications will be earned. Projections are based on students beginning in 2025-2026.

Certification projections are based on an enrollment of 22 students annually per program earning four certifications each. In the 6-year tracking period, students are projected to earn 2,904 certifications. Triumph Gulf Coast will have invested \$2,703.16 per certification.

On behalf of One Okaloosa EDC, I wish to express our enthusiastic endorsement for the proposed project submission by Okaloosa County School District seeking a \$8,350,000 grant award from Triumph Gulf Coast, Inc. in support of acquiring and equipping a location for Okaloosa Technical College North.

As you know, successful economic development is firmly rooted in quality educational and workforce development programs. For many years, Okaloosa Technical College (OTC) has offered comprehensive technical education to our community. While the current OTC location in Fort Walton Beach offers quality programming for the benefit of students and employers alike, the school's considerable distance from the rapidly growing communities and industrial areas of northern Okaloosa County has limited the campus's overall reach and impact.

We are pleased that the building being proposed for acquisition by the Okaloosa County School District offers a strategic location in the Okaloosa Industrial Air Park, adjacent to Bob Sikes Airport, and a mere four miles from the 10,500 acre Shoal River Ranch Gigasite - soon to be home to Central Moloney's \$50 million, 350 person pad-mounted electrical transformer manufacturing facility.
