SUBJECT: Executive Summary – Developing Future Aviation Professionals to Advance Northwest Florida's Aerospace Workforce

- 1. <u>Amount of Funds Being Sought from Triumph Gulf Coast:</u> Choctawhatchee High School's AFJROTC program respectfully requests \$500,000 to acquire and integrate a full-motion aviation simulator and FAA-aligned STEM curriculum—supporting AFJROTC's mission to build citizens of character committed to serving their community and nation.
- 2. <u>Amount and Identity of Other Sources of Funds:</u> In-kind support will be provided by Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University (ERAU) (dual enrollment), the Okaloosa County School District, and existing classroom infrastructure.
- 3. <u>Location of the Project or Program:</u> The program will operate at Choctawhatchee High School in Okaloosa County, a Title I school serving 52% economically disadvantaged and 43% minority students.
- 4. <u>Summary Description of the Proposed Program:</u> This initiative delivers transformational aviation training via simulator-based instruction tied to FAA Part 107 and Private Pilot certification. Students will build STEM and aerospace skills aligned with high-wage career fields, while the program leverages partnerships with ERAU, Civil Air Patrol, and local industry to prepare over 230 cadets annually for the region's evolving workforce needs.
- 5. <u>How the Program Will Promote Economic Recovery and Diversification:</u> By developing a certified, career-ready aviation pipeline, the program drives economic growth, diversifies the workforce, and provides targeted training to students from Okaloosa, Walton, Santa Rosa, and Escambia Counties.
- 6. <u>Summary Timeline:</u> Summer 2025 simulator procurement and setup; Fall 2025 program launch; ongoing instruction and evaluation aligned with Triumph goals.
- 7. <u>Conclusion:</u> This project represents a strategic, sustainable investment in Florida's aerospace workforce and education infrastructure—delivering high-impact, scalable outcomes in a disproportionately affected region.
