Title: Educational Facility Grant Request

Description: The opportunity exists to establish an aviation maintenance (A&P) training facility in Hangar 5 at the Apalachicola Regional Airport in partnership with Haney Technical College. The program will provide certifications in Airframe, Powerplant, and Integrated Avionics Devices (IAD). The facility will be renovated to accommodate classrooms and training space including a hangar that functions as the 'lab'. Target is to begin classes by January 2026

This program will promote economic recovery by creating certified A&P mechanics, which is an enhanced opportunity for an area that saw its seafood industry decimated in 2010. This represents not only diversification of the workforce, but enhances the economy in the area as these jobs have much higher starting salaries than the predominant service industry jobs available today.


The following custom analysis provides demographic analysis of the target area <u>without</u> <u>including Bay County</u> (where the existing campus is located). Comparisons to the population of Bay County to the non-Bay County target area are also made to help understand feasibility of attracting enough students.

The source data for this analysis comes from the United States Census Bureau via the www.census.gov website. Data is from the 2022 estimates based off of the 2020 census.

The map below shows the area within an approximate one hour drive from Apalachicola, excluding the areas in Bay county that are already served by the primary location.

Note: Areas in eastern Bay county that could support students driving for an hour or less are shown on this map, but not included in the numerical analysis. Those areas are included in the counts for Bay county total, which is our comparison base.

Targeted Area



The basic analysis below compares the total population of Bay county to the target area. The underserved target area is defined as 50% of Leon County (the SW region) and all of Wakulla, Franklin, Liberty and Gulf counties. Population comparisons for males and females by age are listed. While student are and will be drawn from areas outside the 'local' area, the purpose of this analysis is to define a comparable population area within a reasonable commute time.

Converting those numbers to ratios comparing numbers from the target area to total Bay County yield the following:

The ratios indicate that there are 1.73 total 15-19 year olds in the target area for each 15-19 year old in Bay County, and so on.

The data speak for themselves. While our target area is larger with potentially longer drive times, it also under-served by secondary education programs, meaning residents from those areas would need to drive significant distances anyway to attend any secondary training. The backlog of applicants at the Panama City main campus may be relieved somewhat by this satellite campus, but we feel the data shows it can stand alone even without that.

3. Explain how the proposed project or program is considered transformational and how it will effect the disproportionately affected counties in the next ten (10) years.

The program addresses the decline of the seafood industry by creating an opportunity for high-paying aviation jobs, as well as supporting long-term regional economic diversification. As the aerospace industry is the fastest growing and predominant industry in our area, these jobs align quite well with demand that already exists. At the present time, students and young adults in Franklin County have very few options as positive as those this opportunity will create. This will be a transformative program for the area.

As this is just an extension of the existing Aviation program at Haney Technical College, we simply point to the success there as a demonstration of viability. Today, Haney Technical College has more applicants than capacity and seeks to expand. Franklin County has infrastructure and community support. The area is in dire need of economic stimulus. This opportunity directly addresses all those facts.

Issuance of FAA Aviation, Powerplant and IAD certifications with a goal of 25+ certifications in 5 years. The jobs created will be higher revenue positions than most in the area.

Supported by Haney Technical College's curriculum and instructors; facility and maintenance by Franklin County. Again, this is an extension of an existing program at Haney Technical that is unable to meet current demand. This satellite operation is a fast and viable way to expand to meet that demand. The growth of the Aerospace industry in our area will ensure that demand exceeds supply for trained aerospace industry workforce for the foreseeable future.

Mechanic: Airframe and PowerPlant

Each student awarded a certificate will have their own unique certificate number (similar to a Driver's License). Certification is all handled through Haney Technical College who is already approved to issue these certificates.

We are confident that the program will certify at least 25 students over the next five years.

The partnership is between two K-20 institutions in Northwest Florida (Haney and Franklin County Schools) and a county government in the same area. It leverages existing resources at the Apalachicola Regional Airport, has clear and measurable outcome measures and has strong support from the Franklin County Board of Commissioners, the Apalachicola Airport Operations and Economic Development Board, and the school district. Incidentally, the school district has already signed contracts and is operating a program, Tango Flight, which will have students from the high school construct a Vans RV12 experimental aircraft. We will be the first school district in Florida to do this. Students who participate in that program will be able to earn approximately a semester's credit in the Haney A&P program. The Director of the Aviation Program at Haney suggested that the school do this with anticipation of the satellite campus at Apalachicola Regional benefiting from it. This is just an example of the strength of this partnership

We could argue that this opportunity touches on each of the discretionary consideration points as described by the Board. Most specifically, it will be transformational to our area which has been impacted so severely by the decline of the seafood industry. It can be consummated very quickly as it is an extension of an existing program at Haney Technical College. It will certainly promote and fill existing jobs that are above the regions household income. It fits with the strategic expansion of the Aerospace Industry in Northwest Florida and supports the growing demand for trained workforce. We are located in a Rural Area of Opportunity, but this will have a wider regional impact as it will help fill jobs in other areas of Florida (and beyond). It is exactly duplicative of an existing program that is highly regarded (Haney's existing A&P program) and enhances the Aerospace focus which is a strategic initiative of our area.

The county has already spent \$50,000 to acquire the space from an existing tennant and will put \$15,000 into the building refurbishment (architect and engineering fees, etc.). While Haney Technical College isn't formally part of this grant, they are also expending several hundred thousand dollars to hire instructors and supply materials for the school.

The Triumph grant should cover 79% of the anticipated \$315,000 required to get the building ready for occupancy.

A minimum of 25 new A&P Certifications will be issued in the next five years. We anticipate the following for enrollment measures:

Cohort 1: 3-5, Cohort 2: 5-7, Cohort 3:7-10, Cohort 4: 10-12 and 12-15 students per cohort thereafter. It is a 2 year program, so the first graduates will be in January of 2028 (after 4 semesters).

Average starting salaries are in the range of \$50,000-\$60,000 with mid-career A&P Mechanic salaries ranging from \$80-100,000.

An architect has already examined the building and Haney Technical College has toured to ensure it meets the requirements they will have. We would like to have the funding as soon as possible so that the building can be refurbished and ready for them to occupy it by late December.

Funds are needed to remove two walls, paint the entire interior, clean and stain the interior replace very old carpet flooring with new tile flooring in all the classrooms, reconfigure the entrance of the building so students will have access and repair the HVAC systems. The Parking Lot needs to be paved and expanded, which will necessitate a gate with a keypad being installed.

All funds will be managed by Franklin County.
