Pensacola Industrial Park and Inland Port: "Beggs Lane" Site



The City of Pensacola respectfully requests \$15,000,000 from Triumph Gulf Coast for design and construction of a warehouse facility on a 58-acre site "Beggs Lane" located in Pensacola, Florida. The request includes associated site improvements to include clearing, stormwater, improvements to the entrance and exit and construction of roadways within the site.

Blue Wind

The facility is required to support the expansion of Blue Wind Technology, LLC, a GE Vernova supplier specializing in composites. Blue Wind currently employs 200 individuals and has been operating in Pensacola since 2019. With the absence of available facilities within the Pensacola MSA, Blue Wind has been forced to seek creative solutions through expanding into multiple facilities along a half mile stretch of road. Space is at such a premium that the company has constructed a tent in the parking lot to handle certain operations. In order to continue to keep

pace with growth in the region, Blue Wind must find a space to grow into.

Triumph funding for facility construction would allow the City of Pensacola and Blue Wind Technology to enter into an agreement whereby the City receives ownership of the 58-acre property and is able to then support not only Blue Wind, but also GE Vernova, as well as other Port of Pensacola tenants by "expanding" the boundaries of the Port of Pensacola and creating an inland Port.



The project would be constructed on publicly owned land. The city of Pensacola would retain ownership of the facility and the space would be leased to Blue Wind Technology.

GE Vernova (GEV)

In March of this year, GE Vernova publicly announced their desire to increase production at the existing Pensacola facility and add 300 jobs. The announcement was made at the ribbon cutting for the new customer experience center, a \$70 million investment in the Pensacola facility and was a key component of an announcement GE Vernova made in January that it will invest nearly \$600 million in its U.S. factories and facilities over the next two years to help meet the surging electricity demands around the world. The new investments – expected to create more than 1,500 new U.S. jobs – will help drive U.S. energy affordability, national security, and competitiveness, and enable the American manufacturing footprint needed to support expanding global exports.

In order for these goals to be met, however, GEV needs additional space (on rail) for their finished product storage. Currently the finished product is trucked to and stored at the Port of Pensacola until it is ready to be shipped out on rail. Due to its relatively small size of 55 acres, the Port is unfortunately not able to accommodate GEV's needs on a long-term basis. As such, the reasons are two-fold for the City's interest in creating an industrial space and an inland Port at the "Begg's Lane" site.

Approval of this project will support multiple levels of the wind energy manufacturing supply chain in the Pensacola area, while also freeing up valuable space at the Port of Pensacola that can be used to attract additional industry or support federal initiatives related to ship building.
