Executive Summary – SeraVida Senior Living

Project Overview:

Franklin and Wakulla Counties currently have zero licensed assisted living facilities, requiring 100% of local seniors and veterans to relocate 40+ miles for care. According to the Bureau of Planning and Evaluation Florida Department of Elder Affairs, in Franklin County alone, veterans make up 62% of residents age 65-84. This means approximately 490 veterans with VA benefits in Franklin County are unable to access local care, highlighting a critical unmet need. **SeraVida proposes a 30–60 unit independent, assisted living and memory care community** to serve seniors and veterans locally, preserving their connection to family, community, and familiar surroundings. This project addresses both social and economic challenges, creating a sustainable, community-centered solution for rural Florida.

Transformational Impact:

- Social impact: Prevents social displacement, preserves mental health, maintains friendships, minimizing cognitive decline through community activities, and reduces loneliness among seniors and veterans.
- Job creation: Generates 50–100 permanent, well paying, local jobs in healthcare, janitorial, landscaping, dietary, administration, and support services such as PT/OT contractors.
- Economic growth: Stimulates the local economy by maintaining the local census, construction, vendor contracts, and increased household income; resulting in considerable and sustained local economic impact

- Workforce development: Offers training programs for allied health professionals and career pathways in elder care. Partnerships may be available for local high school or clinical internships.
- Resident experience: Provides enriched wellness, social, and recreational programs to promote autonomy, dignity, and joy. At SeraVida, we believe that moving into an assisted living community isn't about giving up—it's about gaining the support needed to keep living fully. Our 30–60 unit multi-licensed community will offer a full continuum of care—from independent living to assisted living and memory care—so residents can receive the right level of help right where they are. Whether that means a reminder for medications or a hand with bathing, dressing, grooming, or mobility, we're here to extend independence, not replace it. By helping residents age in place with dignity and connection, SeraVida not only improves quality of life and keeps families together in the place they call home.

Funding & Resources:

- **Triumph Gulf Coast Request:** \$3–10M for land acquisition, construction, equipment, and initial operations. This range is contingent on Franklin County's decision on use or destruction of the Elementary School in Carrabelle as a potential site for SeraVida. It is our preference to utilize an existing structure if one becomes available.
- Other Sources: Local fundraising campaigns, private donations, grants, and potential state/federal programs.
- Community Support: Endorsements from Franklin County VA, local physicians, community leaders, and residents have resulted in the creation of a preemptive waiting list for our proposed community.
