Dear Governor DeSantis, President Albritton and Speaker Perez:

Triumph Gulf Coast is proud to be a part of the economic successes that continue to grow across the eight most disproportionately affected counties affected by the BP Deepwater Horizon oil spill.

As we complete eight and a half years of providing grant funds to those counties, I am pleased to report that as of June 22, 2026 Triumph has 68 active grant projects, with 22 projects already closed, totaling more than \$829,000,000 in awarded grants across Northwest Florida.

As Triumph continues to focus on growth the aviation and aerospace sector, there have been exciting job creation wins across the region related to maritime industry and helping to build America's new Maritime Industrial Base. Triumph members and staff have been regularly



interacting with the national maritime industry and the Florida Department of Commerce to highlight the capabilities and opportunities for such defense and commercial industries to locate in our region. With three state recognized deep water ports and a strong, and growing, maritime workforce, Northwest Florida's assets are a perfect fit for the maritime sector. Triumph stands ready to provide support for this national effort.

Since January 1 of this year, Triumph Gulf Coast has approved a Grant Award Agreement for the Bay County Commission Project Kilowatt (Voltari), for up to \$12,825,000 and 285 new high wage jobs, and a Term Sheet for the City of Pensacola / Port of Pensacola Project Maeve (Birdon) for up to \$76,000,000 and 2000 new jobs for the region which should result in a Grant Award Agreement in Summer 2026. A Term Sheet is being negotiated with the Gulf County Board of County Commissioners for a Ship Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul facility (Eastern Shipbuilding Group) for up to \$23,500,000 and a promise of 400 new high wages jobs for the community. The total grant award amount for these projects is \$112,325,000.

The Bay County Project Kilowatt grant recruited an international electric boat manufacturer to move its headquarters to Panama City and expand its manufacturing capacity creating at least 285 new high wage jobs.

Triumph Gulf Coast requires matching funding for each of its grant awards. The total project investments including Triumph awards and leveraged new funding to the region through matching grants, private and public funding for these three projects exceeds \$264,270,000.

We continue to see evidence of the emergence of industrial hubs and clusters across the region supported by Triumph funding of both public infrastructure and coordinated workforce training programs. Triumph has invested heavily in development of aviation and aerospace, manufacturing, logistics, and research and development. For example, adding the recruitment of the American Magic sailing operations to the Port of Pensacola and the launch of a new University of West Florida workforce training and R&D program WAVE, providing dynamic design capabilities to the marine community resulted in significant interests from additional marine manufacturing projects now locating high wage job creation projects in the region.

By aligning with NWFL's regional economic development strategy, Triumph supports the growth of a skilled workforce positioned to meet the needs of high wage job creators expanding in and being recruited to the region resulting in increased regional household income, the vision of Triumph.

As new projects and programs are funded, we continue to celebrate the success stories from earlier grants.

As the number of active grant awards continues to increase, and the complexity of funding some of those grants increases, the Triumph Board and staff have spent a considerable amount



of time, discussion and action working towards increasing efficient and effective systems for assuring compliance with all fiscal and performance requirements are met by all grantees.

Triumph's milestones to date include:

- *More than \$346 million in infrastructure investments including expansions of two seaports, a major highway bypass to support military missions, a successful maritime industrial park, outside the gate airfield expansion to substantially expand military support missions, industrial parks across the Highways 90 and Interstate 10 corridors with a majority of sites already committed. Job creation projects include aircraft maintenance-repair-overhaul campuses with international partners and customers, electrical transformer manufacturing, pharmaceutical and medical device manufacturing, marine manufacturing, and multiple logistics and distribution facilities.*
- *Over \$417 million in education workforce training including facilities and faculty for airframe, aircraft maintenance and pilot training, a joint venture with the University of Florida and a local school district for development and delivery of artificial intelligence instruction, a Florida State University STEM lab school supporting the post-Hurricane Michael rebuild of Tyndall Air Force Base, four Unmanned Systems drone training programs linked to K-12 school districts, six healthcare training programs that will add 5000 new nurses to the Triumph region within the next 10 years, Career Technical Education (CTE) training in welding, pipefitting, carpentry, construction and industrial trades, HVAC, agriculture sciences, emergency management, fire sciences, health care services, information technology, commercial driving licenses, and engineering/design sponsored by seven K-12 districts, two universities, four state colleges, and a county sheriff's office.*

The net effects to date include:

- *8,485 net new jobs, with all incentivized jobs paying 115% or more of the prevailing wages in the area*
- *88,900 national industry certifications, licensures, or milestones earned by K-12, college, university, retiring military, and military spouses in the very occupational categories most needed in our coastal economy*
- *More than \$1.2 billion in net new family income annually*
- *Uncommon risk-sharing by attracting more than \$1.75 billion in matching funds, attracting private and public sector partners as full investors in every project*



■ *A regional economy more diversified, resilient, and self-reliant than at any other time in our area's history*

A highly unusual feature of Triumph's operation is the strict, objective, measurable performance metrics applied to every project. Binding contracts with qualified applicants and partners ensure that Triumph can reclaim funds in all cases if metrics aren't achieved. Since our goal is to get the funds into the local economies, Triumph continues to work with the grantees to overcome any obstacles that may arise over the course of the grant. To date, not one of the funded projects has been cited for non-performance nor have any funds had to be clawed back.

Triumph has provided extensive hands-on help to applicants to qualify for funding, evaluated every proposal with due diligence, return on investment, and job-creation viability prior to every award, and managed and monitored every project for contract compliance and faithful performance.

Triumph Gulf Coast is independently audited by outside auditors and is examined and audited annually by the Auditor General of Florida. Not once in its existence has Triumph been cited or criticized by any auditor or oversight body.

Triumph Gulf Coast's original directors completed their terms in 2022, which, by law, cannot be extended. Directors who have served since the organization's inception, and their appointing authorities, are:
